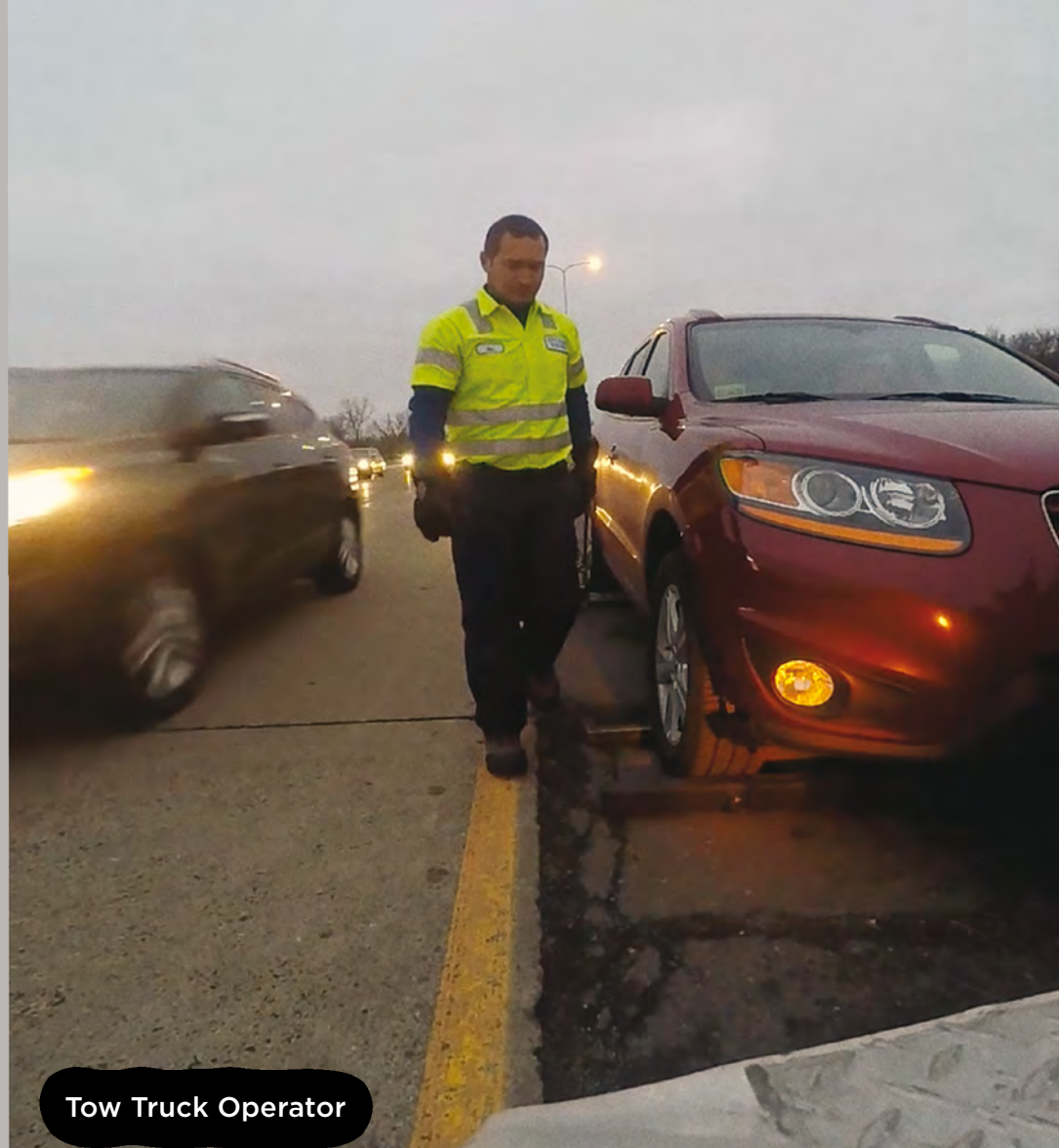
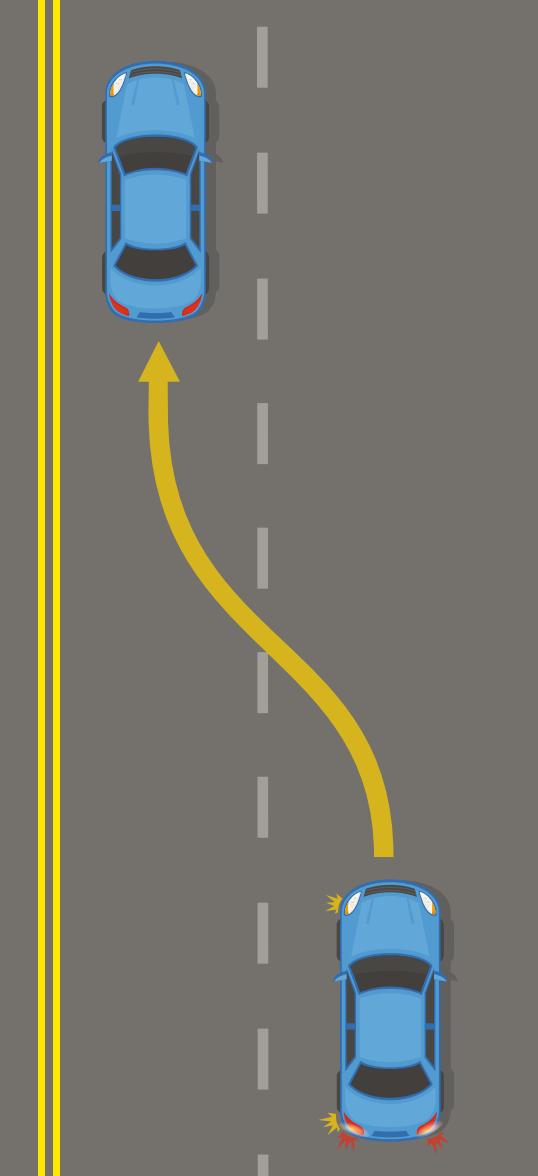

HONORING THE PAST

A daughter shares memories of her late father's remarkable career with the CHP

Her eyes light up as she opens the slightly musky vintage suitcase from the 1940s. As the locks click open she unveils a lifetime of her late father's memories. Sepia-toned photos are scattered on the table and well-worn cards and wallets appear, along with his brass ID badge. She pulls out a wooden box with a blue velvet lining containing a commemorative handgun - still in pristine condition - along with a heavy leather gun holster and belt. The patina on the pair of handcuffs hints at a thousand stories of past arrests made.

When 11-99 member, Diane Klemme shared with us that her late father was a CHP officer and she still has quite the collection of mementos spanning his 37-year career, we were compelled to learn more.

Born in 1915, fourteen-year-old David Tyler Donaldson supported his mother as his father died when he was young. After graduating from the CHP Academy in 1936, David was presented ID badge #62 and assigned to the Sacramento area office. He and his wife, Genevieve, raised Diane and her two brothers, Jay and Richard, in Sacramento. Diane fondly remembers mornings as a child seeing her dad in uniform leaving home to start his shift. "He was a pillar of the community and I felt so proud that he was my dad."



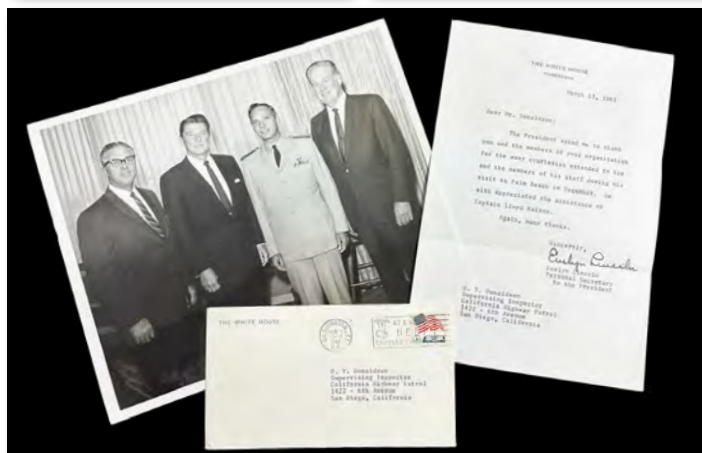
CHP Supervising Inspector

After years of working at various Northern CA area offices, David was promoted to Supervising Inspector at the San Diego area office so the family made the move south where they lived until he retired in 1973.

Her father was "a keeper", as Diane explains, and thankfully some historic moments live on through his artifacts. Early on as a motor officer, David had the honor of escorting Governor Frank Merriam's motorcade across the Golden Gate Bridge on opening day in 1937 (*riding second from the left in the postcard below*). He escorted President Kennedy during a visit to Palm Beach just a few months before his assassination, and met with President Reagan during one of his visits. He also spent some time working and training with the Policia Federal in Mexico.

Diane reflects upon growing up as the child of a CHP officer, idolizing her father and also recognizing how hard it was for her mother, a homemaker, who often spent days at a time alone with her children. She understands the challenges and dangers involved for officers, especially today. So whether it's buying an officer dinner or supporting the 11-99 Foundation, Diane will always hold a torch for law enforcement in memory of **her idol - her father, David.**

CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee

On February 3, 2023, Commissioner Sean Duryee (pictured left) was appointed by the Governor to serve as the 17th Commissioner of the CHP. Commissioner Duryee is a 25-year veteran of the CHP. Prior to joining the Department, Duryee served active duty in the United States Army for four years. In 1998, Commissioner Duryee entered the CHP Academy, and has held every rank in the Department, from CHP Cadet through Deputy Commissioner.

As the nation's largest state police agency, the CHP consists of nearly 11,000 CHP employees, with an operational budget of approximately \$3.2 billion dollars. While serving in this capacity, Commissioner Duryee is responsible for maintaining the safety and security of millions of residents and visitors across the State.

After being named Chief of Southern Division in 2021 and having served in the Department for 25 years, Chief Chris Margaritis (pictured right) was appointed as the new CHP Departmental Liaison to the 11-99 Foundation by Commissioner Duryee.

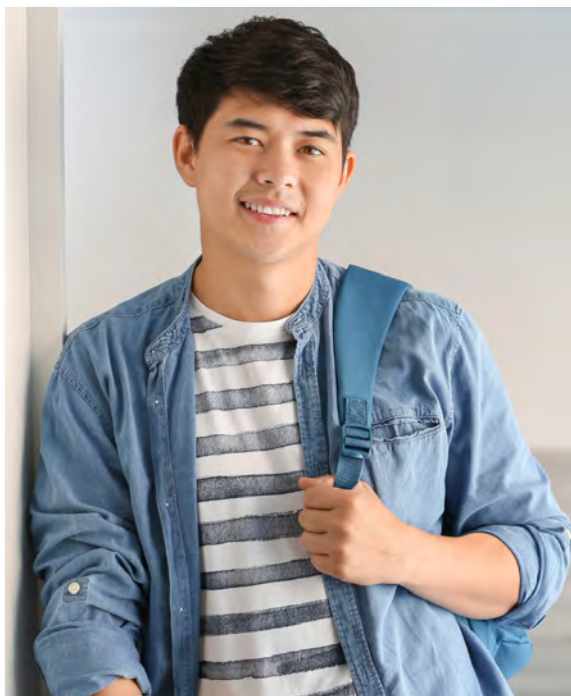

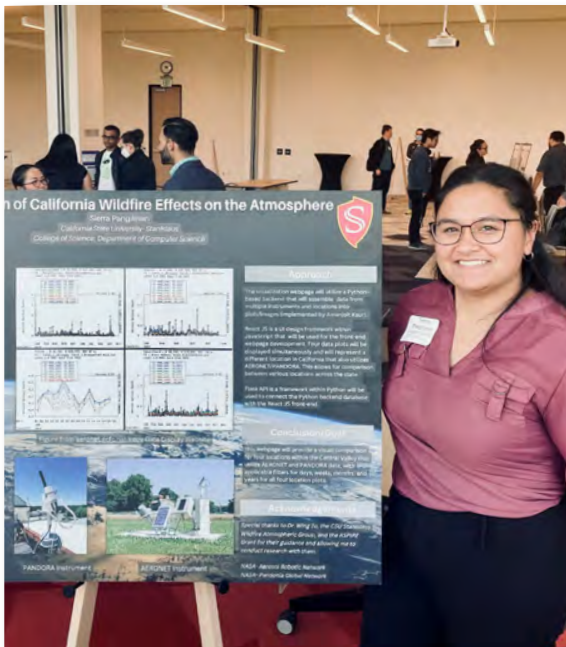
RECOVERED & HELPING OTHERS

It wasn't until Gil became more involved with the organization that he discovered the scholarship program and the "generous educational support provided which is important to me," he says.

The Amorosos have been members now for eight years. Gil shares, "The first time I met a CHP officer was many years ago. He was a former CHP motorcycle officer who had suffered a serious accident and had to retire with long-lasting injuries. I got to know him and was impressed with his positive attitude, kindness, and also the long-term help he received from the Foundation at the time."

Born in San Francisco, Gil is a Bay Area native to the core. After running his family business with his brothers for nearly two decades, Gil and Jenny's current business, S. J. Amoroso Properties Co., is centered on owning and managing commercial real estate in California and Oregon.

The couple says, "We'd love for people interested in becoming members to know the Foundation is more than a license plate frame; it's an organization that takes care of its members and families in time of need as well as providing excellent educational opportunities for the younger generation, which would otherwise be unavailable."

Gil shares that the greatest joys in his life are being married to the kindest and most positive person he's ever known, and watching their two children and their families grow into responsible, caring adults.

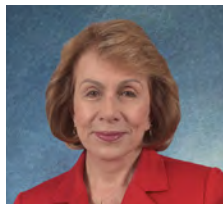
