In a year when most non-profits saw a downturn due to the economy, we had realistic expectations of a challenging year ahead. Even during the pandemic, the unprecedented support we continued to receive from members was incredible and we were able to sustain the level of assistance we had always been able to provide to the CHP community.

As all charitable giving ebbs and flows with the times, we thought surely our luck had run out when in early December we were facing our largest outstanding goal yet left to raise by year end. However, something we have come to learn after 42 years of existence is that when the call for help is made, *YOU*, our 11-99 family will show up for the CHP just as they show up for us. Not only did we meet our fundraising goal, but we surpassed it thanks to our donors coming through big in the final days of the year. **To date, we've provided nearly \$50 million in assistance to CHP families since 1982.**

Our vocational and academic scholarship program continues to grow - last year we awarded **over 1,000 children of CHP employees with \$3.3 million in scholarship funds** - another record year.

In 2023, we provided \$125,000 in emergency and death benefit assistance

and direct regional support to CHP families and area offices across the state. We are fortunate for the second year in a row that no uniformed CHP officers were killed in the line of duty, although we must always budget and forecast for the worst so that we're always there to support families when they need it the most.

Thank YOU, our 11-99 community for answering our call for help. Because of your generosity, CHP families will be taken care of this year.

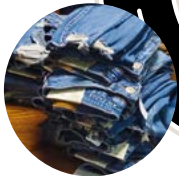

STORIES AND HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAST YEAR

ROADSIDE DELIVERY ON A RURAL HIGHWAY IN CENTRAL CALIFORNIA



On the morning of Saturday, July 8, 2023, the CHP Bakersfield Communications Center received an alert about a medical emergency on a rural highway southwest of Bakersfield. Officers Daniel Pence (17230), Eric Krahn (21365), and Andrew Johnson (17254) from the Buttonwillow Area were dispatched to respond.

Officer Pence, the first to arrive, discovered a woman in active labor in a car parked on the shoulder of State Route 119 a few miles west of I-5. **Utilizing his training, Officer Pence, assisted by Officer Krahn, successfully delivered a healthy baby girl at 7:32 a.m.** Officer Johnson arrived shortly after to provide additional support. Emergency medical personnel from the Kern County Fire Department took over care of the newborn and her mother.

Officer Pence visited baby Daleyza and her family, now considered part of his extended family. He was pleased to report that baby Daleyza was in excellent health.

THE CHP ASSISTS IN COMBATING THE FENTANYL CRISIS IN SAN FRANCISCO

On May 1, 2023, Governor Gavin Newsom launched a multi-agency enforcement operation, calling on the CHP to assist San Francisco authorities in combating the deadly fentanyl crisis that threatens the public health and safety of the city’s residents.

This collaborative, multifaceted effort, called *Operation San Francisco Safe Streets*, brings together the CHP, California National Guard, San Francisco Police Department (SFPD), California Department of Justice, and the San Francisco District Attorney’s Office, all focused on improving public safety, targeting and disrupting fentanyl trafficking, and holding drug traffickers accountable. This operation comes as San Francisco has struggled to deal with an alarming rise in deaths linked to fentanyl. The synthetic opioid, more potent and deadly than heroin, is the leading cause of overdose deaths in San Francisco and the United States.

This year, over 560 people have died from accidental overdoses in San Francisco, over 400 of them due to fentanyl. **In the first six weeks of the operation, CHP officers seized 4.2 kilos of fentanyl—enough to potentially kill 2.1 million people. “The CHP’s recent results in San Francisco are nothing short of extraordinary,” commented Governor Newsom in June. By early October 2023, the CHP had confiscated nearly 18 kilos of fentanyl.**

While the SFPD has concentrated on drug transactions taking place on city sidewalks, the CHP has strategically deployed teams of officers focused on high-visibility traffic enforcement. This effort has resulted in over 160 arrests related to possession of fentanyl and other illegal drugs, possession of illegal firearms, and driving under the influence. Additionally, the CHP has deployed patrol units equipped with automated license plate readers to assist in locating stolen vehicles. Since the beginning of the operation, over 80 stolen vehicles have been recovered within the targeted neighborhoods. Beyond its enforcement activities, the CHP is also providing specialized classes in Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement and Drug Recognition Expert training to SFPD personnel. This training aims to enhance the city’s detection, deterrence, and prevention of drug and alcohol-related crimes.

In early August, SFPD Chief Bill Scott announced that the number of drug arrests in 2023 had already surpassed the total for all of 2022. “The San Francisco Police Department welcomes the assistance from our state partners in combating this deadly drug crisis,” said Chief Scott. “Working collaboratively with the CHP, we’ve seized an unprecedented amount of fentanyl and other deadly narcotics, and I look forward to building on our success.” Since the start of the operation, the CHP and the SFPD have joined forces to enhance the quality of life in San Francisco neighborhoods plagued by assaults, drug trafficking, and ongoing criminal activities linked to the fentanyl crisis. Both law enforcement agencies have expressed their gratitude for the community support they’ve received while striving to protect these areas.



CHP Motors Take Historic Ride Into Washington, D.C. During National Police Week

For the first time in its history, the CHP sent motor officers to participate in National Police Week in Washington, D.C.

Members of the Department made the journey in May to honor fallen law enforcement officers. The team riding from New York City to Washington, D.C., included Solano Area Sergeant Adam McCarron (15762), South Sacramento Area Officer Scott Pierson (14512), Office of the Academy Officer Scott Riley (15618), and Newhall Area Officer Cody Ornelas (22401). Commissioner Duryee commended the officers for their outstanding participation in the event. He also extended special thanks to the Office of Employee Safety and Assistance and the Office of Community Outreach, Marketing, and Recruitment teams for their behind-the-scenes support and documentation of this historic occasion.

The 11-99 Foundation provided some assistance with travel costs for those in attendance, and will be doing the same this coming May.



CHARLIE'S DAY AT THE CHP ACADEMY

Charlie is an 8-year-old boy from Portola, a small town in the Sierra Nevada Mountains about 65 miles north of Lake Tahoe. Charlie was already familiar with the CHP because of their presence during past wildfires, but in May 2023, he became more acquainted with our officers, and a special bond was formed.

On May 17, 2023, Charlie's school went on lockdown after an active threat incident was reported. Officers from the CHP's Quincy Area responded, secured the perimeter, and safely escorted the students out of the school. One of those officers, Officer Seth Preston (18506), returned to the school several times over the following days, played sports with the kids, and interacted with them to ensure they felt safe. **During one of his visits, Officer Preston learned one of the students, Charlie, had been diagnosed with leukemia a few months earlier. Officer Preston**

began devoting his time to Charlie and sent him a personal video wishing him well during his chemotherapy treatments.

This bond led to a special day being planned for Charlie. Following a medical appointment on September 19, 2023, Charlie's 8th birthday, Charlie and his family were invited to the CHP Academy for a personalized visit.



Upon their arrival at the Academy, Charlie, his mother, and his sister were escorted by Captain Jaimi Kenyon (18214) to the CHP aircraft hangars, where they were greeted by Lieutenant Commander Chris Parent (15803), Lieutenant Matt Radke (14915), Officer Preston, and several other CHP representatives. Charlie was introduced to Traveler, one of the draft horses of the CHP's Mounted Patrol Unit. Charlie was hoisted up into the saddle for a bird's eye view of his entourage. He also met the CHP SWAT Team and was given a tour inside the armored SWAT vehicle.

The highlight of Charlie's day was the EVOC track. Charlie and his family were driven out to the grandstands, where Charlie was fitted with a safety helmet and buckled into the passenger seat of Officer Jason Nelson's (20805) Dodge Charger. With a thumbs-up from Charlie, the two headed out on the course, where Officer Nelson showed Charlie what it is like to drive like a CHP officer.



Following the track activities, **Charlie was introduced to CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee (15584) and shown around the inside of a CHP helicopter that landed on the Academy grounds.** After taking pictures with the Commissioner, it was off to lunch and Charlie's next adventure.

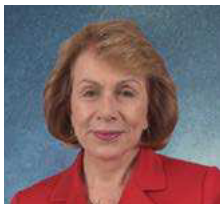

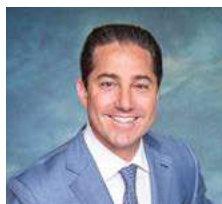
