Our commitment to education remains steadfast. In 2024, we awarded over 1,100

children of CHP employees with a record-breaking \$3.5 million in scholarship funds. Additionally, we provided over \$261,000 in direct support to CHP through emergency and death benefits, and regional support to area offices.

Since our inception, total benefits provided to CHP families have reached nearly \$8.7 million, while total scholarships awarded now amount to almost \$44 million-bringing our combined total assistance to an astounding \$52.2 million. For another consecutive year, we are profoundly grateful that no uniformed CHP officers were lost in the line of duty. However, we remain vigilant, ensuring that resources are always available for families in times of need.



OFFICERS RECEIVE GOVERNOR'S PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER MEDAL OF VALOR

On February 27, 2024, Governor Gavin Newsom, alongside Attorney General Rob Bonta and CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee, presented the Governor's Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor to CHP Officers Jeremy Welch, Aaron Adair, and Troy Wiltshire for their extraordinary bravery.

Officer Aaron Adair was honored for rescuing an unconscious driver from a burning vehicle on Interstate 10, suffering burns in the process. Officers Jeremy Welch and Troy Wiltshire received the award for stopping a high-speed wrong-way driver by using their patrol vehicle as a barrier, preventing a catastrophic crash.

"These officers displayed incredible courage and selflessness," said Commissioner Duryee. Their heroic actions exemplify the CHP's dedication to public safety and service, going above and beyond the call of duty to protect California's communities.

SIX CHP OFFICERS RECEIVE GOVERNOR'S STATE EMPLOYEE MEDAL OF VALOR

On June 25, 2024, Governor Gavin Newsom honored six CHP officers with the prestigious Governor's State Employee Medal of Valor at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento. Each officer received the Special Act Award (Gold), California's highest recognition for employees who risk their lives to save others.

Officer Jose A. Benitez was recognized for his lifesaving actions on May 2, 2023. While patrolling a rural road in Kings County, he witnessed a vehicle veer off the roadway, strike a power pole, and land in a canal, rapidly filling with water. Without hesitation, Officer Benitez entered the canal and found a semi-conscious pregnant woman trapped in the driver's seat. He pulled her out through the window and safely assisted her to the canal bank, preventing what could have been a tragic outcome.

Officers Michael Estey and Luis F. Rodriguez were awarded for their exceptional bravery on June 6, 2020, when they responded to an ambush in Ben Lomond. A domestic terrorist had fatally shot a Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Sergeant and was firing at responding officers. As Officers Estey and Rodriguez approached, their patrol vehicle was struck multiple times by gunfire. Despite the extreme danger, they engaged the shooter, wounding him and preventing further loss of life. Their quick actions undoubtedly saved lives that day.

Officers Chad Smith and Flight Officer/Paramedic Jon Wion were honored for their heroic response to a private plane crash in Redding on August 27, 2020. The officers navigated a steep, brush-covered ravine to reach the wreckage, where two victims were trapped—one on fire. They provided immediate aid as CHP personnel battled surrounding flames. As fire crews arrived, the officers assisted in carrying the severely injured victims up the steep embankment to awaiting ambulances.

Officer Christian Lara demonstrated extraordinary courage on November 30, 2022, in San Diego County. He spotted a crashed vehicle partially hanging over an overpass, engulfed in flames with the driver still inside. With no time to spare, Officer Lara broke the passenger window, pried the door open, and pulled the driver to safety before the vehicle was consumed by fire.

"These officers embody the true spirit of public service, putting their own lives at risk to save others," said Governor Newsom. "Their selfless actions reflect the highest values of the CHP."



CHP CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF WOMEN IN THE DEPARTMENT

This past September, the CHP celebrated a historic milestone-50 years since women were first allowed to join its ranks. Governor Gavin Newsom and CHP Executive Management honored for the CHP. this occasion as members of the inaugural Women Traffic Officer Project (WTOP) class reunited at the 50th Anniversary WTOP Gala in Sacramento to celebrate their legacy and service.

On September 30, 1974, 41 women joined the Meadowview CHP Academy alongside 42 male cadets as part of a ground-breaking two-year experimental program to determine if women could effectively serve as state traffic officers. On January 16, 1975, 27 women graduated, proving their ability to complete the rigorous 16-week training. Five of the top eight academic graduates were women, and one earned a perfect score in pistol shooting.

Their journey didn't end at graduation—each officer's field performance was closely evaluated, with the understanding that unsatisfactory results could disgualify the entire class. After two years,

the U.S. Department of Justice confirmed that employing women as state traffic officers was not only feasible but successful, ushering in a new era

"Law enforcement is not a 'male' or 'female' profession," said Commissioner Durvee. "It is a profession of service and sacrifice. The inaugural class served with dedication, paving the way for future generations. We owe them a great debt of gratitude."

Over the past 50 years, women have held every rank within the CHP, from officer to Commissioner, serving in diverse roles such as motorcycle officers, pilots, K-9 handlers, investigators, mounted patrol, and more.

In honor of this milestone, the CHP released a commemorative video featuring firsthand accounts from members of the Women Traffic Officer Project (WTOP) class, celebrating their legacy and lasting impact on law enforcement.

K-9 Beny Retires After **Storied** Career

Over his career, K-9 Beny seized over \$10,000,000 in currency from the sale of narcotics and prevented massive quantities of drugs from reaching our streets, including (but not limited to) 42 pounds of heroin, 206 pounds of fentanyl, 233 pounds of cocaine, and 750 pounds of methamphetamine. In addition to his seizures, Beny helped execute approximately 30 apprehensions and 200 arrests.

At his retirement celebration, Beny received certificates of recognition from State Assembly and U.S. Congressional representatives, praise from the Merced County District Attorney, and a much-deserved prime rib steak. Beny's handler, Sergeant Shane Kensey (15653), described their bond as unbreakable, noting that Beny always answered the call to help save the day. Beny's service and legacy will leave a lasting mark on the community.

Officers Andre Moye Jr. and Andy Ornelas Memorialized

T wo fallen CHP officers were recently honored with freeway sign dedication ceremonies in Southern California. Family, friends, and colleagues gathered to pay tribute to CHP Officer Andre Moye Jr. (EOW August 12, 2019) and CHP Officer Andy Ornelas (EOW December 2, 2020).



On September 3, 2024, a memorial sign dedication ceremony was held at the Moreno Valley Conference and Recreation Center, marking the designation of Interstate 215 from the Eucalyptus Avenue overcrossing to the State Route 60 junction in Riverside County as the CHP Officer Andre M. Moye Jr. Memorial Freeway.

To honor Officer Ornelas, a memorial sign dedication ceremony was held on December 2, 2024, at The Highlands Church in Palmdale. The State Legislature designated the portion of State Route 14 from the Avenue O-8 bridge to the Avenue M overcrossing in Palmdale as the CHP Officer Andy Ornelas Memorial



O n July 11, 2024, the CHP Merced Area celebrated the retirement of perhaps the CHP's bestknown canine, Beny. Beny began serving California in 2015 in Golden Gate Division as a dual-purpose K-9 (criminal apprehension and narcotic detection). He transferred to Central Division in 2018, earning national recognition for his outstanding drug detection and prevention efforts. Beny was also a


